

Kettle & Fish News, May 2013

May looks set fair to be another very busy month for *Churches Together in Sudbury & District (CTiS)*. *Kettle & Fish* will operate on four Thursdays. On the 9th of the month a children's fun event organized by the town's *Fairtrade Group* will follow *K&F*. On Saturday 5 May, at Paul Roach's premises in Acton, *JagFest* will take place – check the bright red posters. The event will host a large number of classic Jaguars and stage other activities associated with those beautiful cars; various *CTiS* groups will be present, and profits made are to be shared between the *Eden's Project* and *Future Vision* – two of *CTiS*'s projects whose aim it is to introduce youngsters to Christian things. *Christian Aid Week* runs from 12 to 18 May, when large numbers of volunteers take to the streets and go from door to door collecting on behalf of this extremely important relief organization. *Christian Aid*, as the DVDs running in *Kettle & Fish* show, is dedicated to help people escape from poverty; this year's campaign has the theme 'bite back at hunger'. The week begins with a service at 6.30pm at Sudbury Baptists' Church. Be great if local folk could be especially generous this year. The third major event is *Pentecost Praise*, held here in St Peter's on Sunday 19 May, with an internationally renowned speaker – Jeff Lucas; an evening of laughter, learning and living is promised. The first Pentecost was instrumental in establishing the Christian Church in Jerusalem – we pray that the Holy Spirit will be powerful in Sudbury two thousand years on.
